2024 Days of Significance for Proclamation

Awareness Campaign	Date	Description
World Sustainable Procurement Day	March 21, 2024	World Sustainable Procurement Day started in March 2022 during the spring equinox and continues to run each year. The purpose of this day is to empower and equip Procurement Practitioners with knowledge, best practices, and practical solutions to sustainable procurement challenges.
United Nations' International Day of Forests	March 21, 2024	The United Nations General Assembly proclaimed March 21 the International Day of Forests in 2012 to celebrate and raise awareness of the importance of all types of forests. The purpose of this day is to organize activities involving forests and trees, such as tree planting campaigns.

World Water Day	March 22, 2024	World Water Day is an annual observance on March 22 to celebrate water and raises awareness of the 2 billion people living without access to safe water. Theme varies every year.
Earth Hour	March 23, 2024	Earth Hour is an annual event on the last Saturday of the month of March from 8:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Millions across the world choose to turn off their lights for one hour to celebrate their commitment to the planet. The objective is to spread awareness of environmental issues in our global and local communities.
Earth Month/Week/Day	April 2024	Earth Month is the entire month of April, Earth Week is April 21-27 and Earth Day is on April 22. These are annual celebrations of environmental action.
Provincial Day of Action on Litter	May 14, 2024	The Provincial Day of Action on Litter is celebrated on the second Tuesday of May each year in Ontario and promotes taking action to prevent and reduce litter and waste.
World Bee Day	May 20, 2024	World Bee Day is celebrated on May 20 each year to raise awareness of the importance of pollinators, the threats they face and their contribution to sustainable development.
International Day for Biological Diversity	May 22, 2024	International Day for Biological Diversity is celebrated on May 22 each year to increase understanding and awareness of biodiversity issues.
World Environment Day	June 5, 2024	World Environment Day is the United Nations Day for encouraging worldwide awareness and action to protect our environment.
Pollinator Week	June 17 to 23, 2024	Pollinator Week is a time to celebrate the important role pollinators like bees, birds, bats, and butterflies play in our local ecosystem and in supporting global food production.

National Forest Week	September 22 to 28, 2024	National Forest Week is celebrated during the third week of September to raise awareness about one of the most valuable and renewable resources – forests.
Energy Efficiency Day	October 2, 2024	Energy Efficiency Day is on the first Wednesday of October to raise awareness of the benefits of energy efficiency.
Waste Reduction Week	October 14 to 20, 2024	Waste Reduction Week is an annual campaign held during the third week of October that educates and promotes waste reduction while encouraging new and innovative ideas for dealing with Canada's waste.
